



2025 SUSI (Study of the U.S. Institutes) for Secondary Educators: Teachers and Administrators

General Information and Instructions

Program Description	The U.S. Mission to Mexico is pleased to announce the Study of the U.S. Institutes (SUSI) for Secondary Educators. This is an intensive post-graduate level academic program that provide secondary school educators and administrators (including teachers, administrators, teacher trainers, curriculum developers, textbook writers, Ministry of Education officials, and others) the opportunity to deepen their understanding of U.S. society, culture, values, and institutions. The program goal is to strengthen curricula and to enhance the quality of teaching about the United States in secondary schools. The SUSI for Secondary Educators will focus on content and materials about the United States, rather than teaching methods and pedagogy; and the institute for administrators will focus on sociocultural understanding, equitable learning communities, and diversity and inclusion in U.S. education and society. This SUSI will include a series of lectures, panels, seminar discussions, readings, workshops, site visits, meetings with practitioners in the field, and cultural activities. The program features curriculum based on the study of how America's foundations and historical development have shaped and continue to inform U.S. politics, economics, and society. Community service activities are a key cultural component of the program and provide participants with a first-hand experience of how volunteerism plays a vital role in U.S. civil society.

- Be aware that the program schedule and syllabus are designed for the group and sessions will not be customized for individual interests.
- Be willing to respectfully engage with fellow participants representing different backgrounds and different points of view.
- Be able to attend all lectures and organized activities and complete assigned readings. If the program is conducted virtually, the same participation requirements apply.
